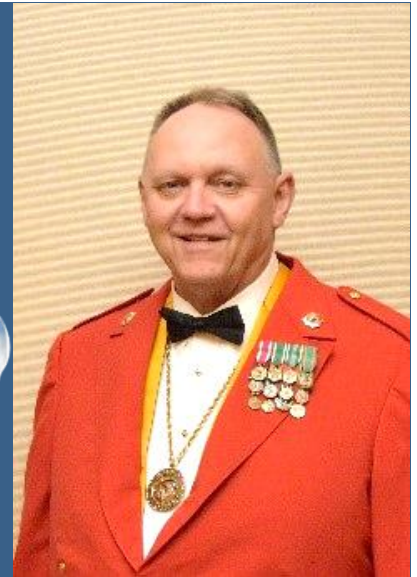

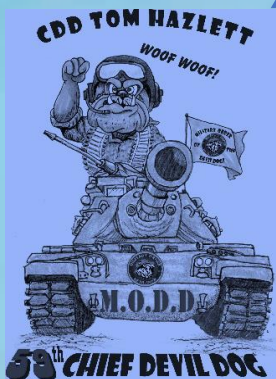

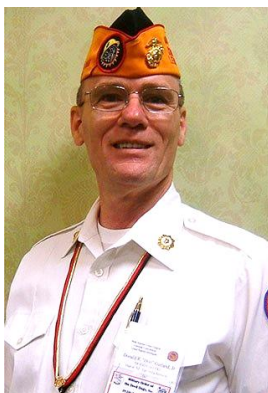

Good day Dogs, the 2021 Marine Corps League Convention will be probably the largest gathering of Devil Dogs going up for their PPD for many years. I think the weather will be good for the events. The average temperature will be in the 80's and about 60 at night. If you were at the Mini-Growl in October, you probably heard my little talk about what I would like all the Handlers and Assistant Handlers to do before the Convention. If not, here is what I would like.

Before arrival, please tell all prospective PPD's to bring:

1. At least a week's worth of medications and a current prescription for the meds. (in case the medications are misplaced or lost).
I just was informed that in-room fridges are not common at the hotel. Neither are microwaves. Please bring an insulated bag for ice. Put your meds in a plastic bag before placing the meds in the insulated bag.
2. A file card listing their medications and allergies.
3. On the file card the phone number of their doctor.
4. On the file card place a list of their medical problems, i.e., Diabetes, heart problems, stroke, bad backs, or joints problems.
5. The name of anyone traveling with them and their cell phone number.

This card will be attached to their ID lanyard for prompt identification if a problem arises.

I expect a medical crew of 4 trained professionals, 3 Males, and 1 Lady, all Registered Nurses, and/or experienced in Emergency care. We will be available throughout the week starting August 7. My cell number will be 443.756.0886. The other cell numbers will be given at the BAS. We will be wearing a white coat, some covered with patches, others not. There will be roving patrols where the Devil Dogs will be, inside or out. If there is a problem, call me first. I will alert the other team members. If I don't answer, call another Corpsman.

All Devil Dogs will be inspected and questioned about their Veterinary history at the Dog House, if they cannot show a recent rabies tag, they will be given my own personal Anti-Rabies and Flea medication. This will be administered at the BAS on arrival and check-in. A tag will be issued to them that will be displayed on their person at all times. A small bone fee will be collected. Remember, the Fleas will be a constant annoyance, so it is important that each Dog is vaccinated. We will have protein meat sticks for sale also.

Please, strongly reintegrate that this week is a fun week, a week of learning what it is to be a PPD, a week of bonding, and learning how to work together. There will be some Devil Dogs who push themselves to their limit or beyond because they don't want to look weak in front of their peers. This is where the Handlers come into play. If you see someone hurting, stop them, let them rest or call for assistance.

I am now available for questions from 8 AM to 8 PM. Please call me or leave a msg with your name and telephone number. My e-mail is formernavalperson1@hotmail.com I will return the call ASAP. Here is a little memory bug for everyone.

Signs of a Stroke: **Balance** - unable to keep balance
Eye - blurred or loss of vision in one or both eyes
Face - uneven smile or tongue moves to one side
Arm - weakness in one or both arms
Speech - slurred
Time - get help fast

or in other words **BEFAST**. The first hour is critical. The stroke can be minimized within that hour with the proper medicine.

I am looking forward to a great and fun Convention.

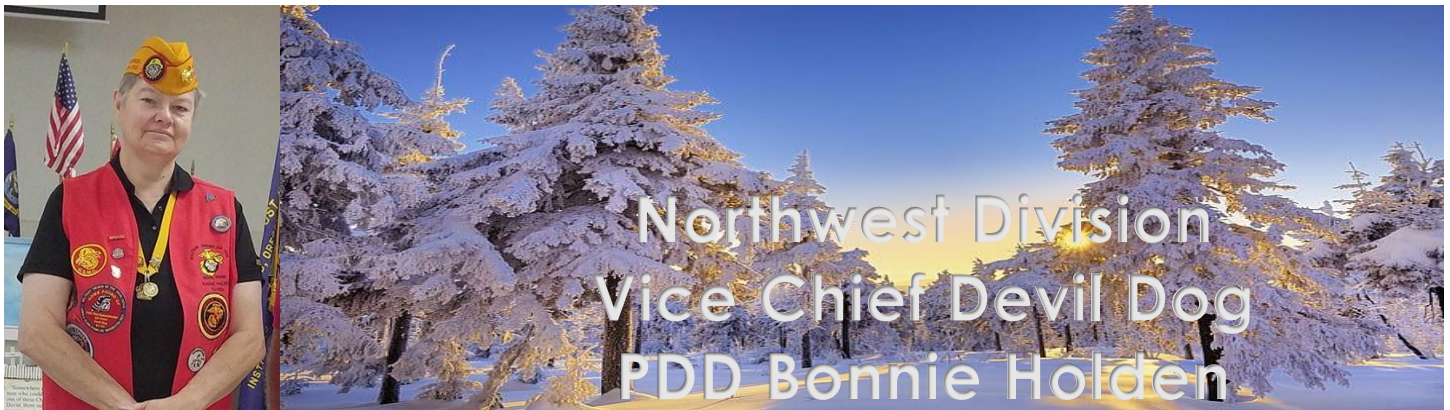

Oregon Pack Leader Clyde (Tony) Rizzutto was interviewed by the local paper on his time in the Marines.

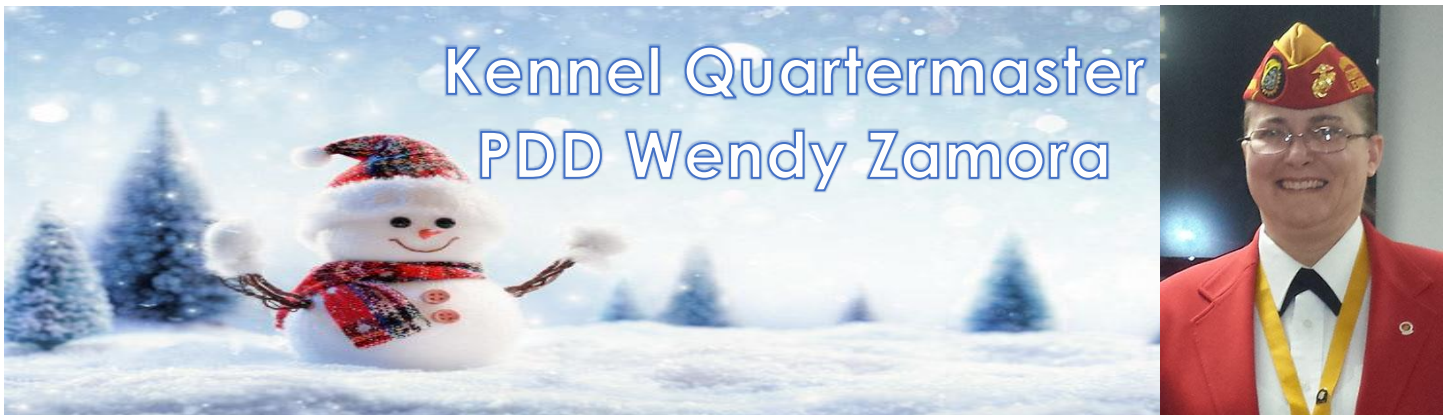

If there is something that you need, you can order by email, snail mail or by calling. I am currently working a dayshift schedule, so please call after 5:30pm eastern time.

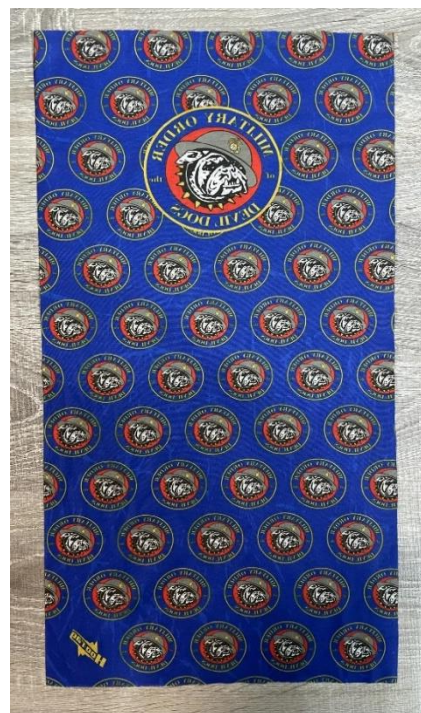

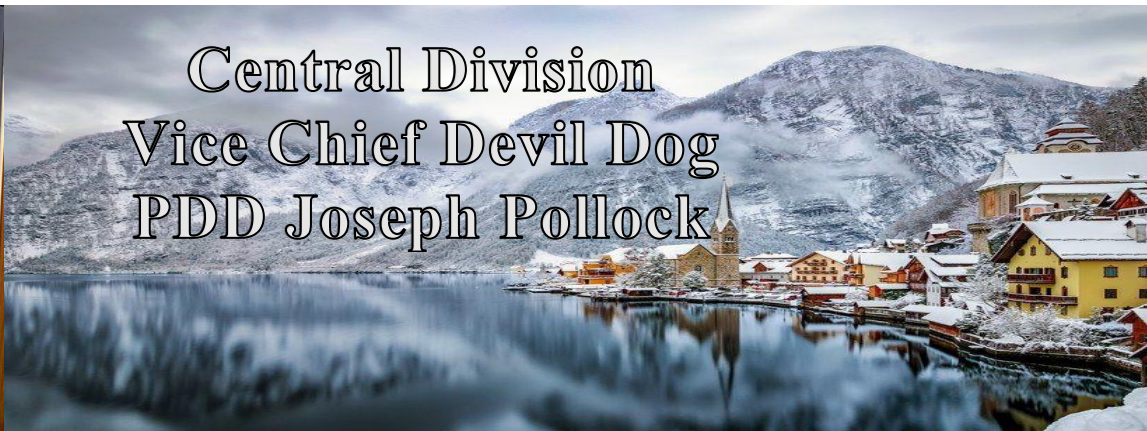

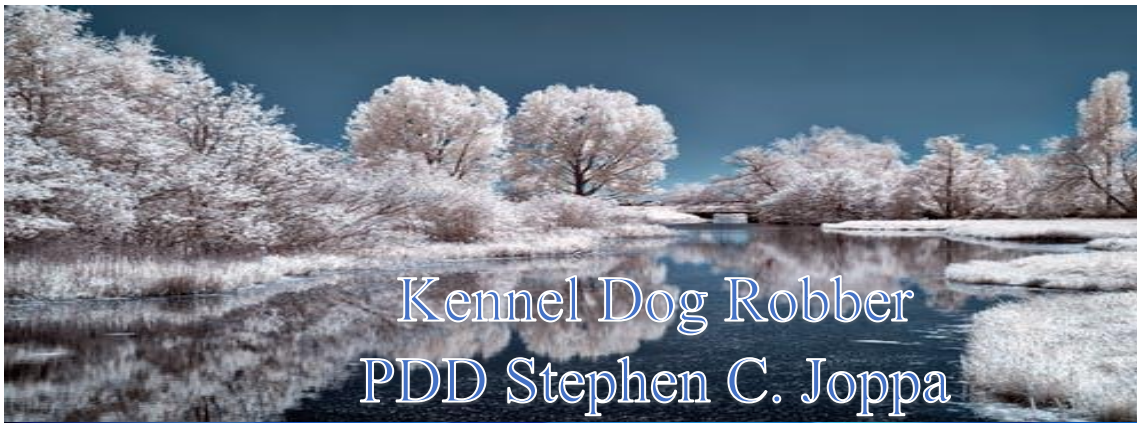
So, I ask that all our Pack and Pound Keepers, forward any information you might have to me as soon as possible.

Dues transmittals continue to come in at a moderate pace. The by-laws say that all renewals are due on September 1. If you have not renewed your dues for the 2021 year, you may not legally attend any Growls or participate in any MODD activities. Please get your renewals to your Dog Robber so they may be transmitted to Kennel and you can hold a current membership card.

Dog Robbers: Please contact your members and get the transmittals in promptly. New applications for membership are down from previous years. If you have quality members in your Detachment invite them to become members of the MODD. We are always looking for "Good Dogs".

Elections and Installation Reports are required to be completed by mid-November. Attached is a list of those reports for each Pound and Pack. If your Pound or Pack does not show 2021 in the date field, please get a copy submitted right away.

Passport stamp Bones are to be collected from each member in attendance at a Growl. Attached is a list of the Bones received so far this fiscal year. If your Pound does not appear on the list it means that no bones have been received. Please collect the Bones at each Growl and submit them promptly. The by-laws require them to be submitted after each Growl.

IRS 990's were to be submitted to the IRS by the middle of November. (If the fiscal year you are using is July to June). If your Pound or Pack has not complied, you need to get it done. You stand to lose your nonprofit status if you do not comply with the IRS regulations. Send the IRS notice of filing to me so it and your EIN number may be recorded. The IRS is making a big push to shut down non-profits that do not file. If you do not have an EIN number you need to get one and send the number to me so we can get you on the list of MCL subsidiaries and registered as such with the IRS. Noncompliance may result in taxes being imposed on any income as well as severe penalties from the IRS.

We are all looking forward to the Mid-Winter Growl in Virginia in Feb. I hope to see many of you in attendance. Remember, this is the only Kennel level Growl that any Dog may attend.

After you have made sure that you have complied with all of the above you can go back to your nap by the fireplace and make sure the food and water bowl are close by so that you do not have to exert yourself too much. Have a Merry Christmas and I wish each and every one a joyous and prosperous New Year.
