

Please keep checking on the Dogs in your Pound and Pack. If any need help and you do not have the means to provide, please reach out.


We are a family, no one needs to be alone or doing without.

I hope to see everyone at the "Gathering" this year in Ocean City, Maryland from October 1st thru the 4th (collared shirt and jeans, no uniform). If you can't make the "Gathering", then I hope to see you at Mid-Winter. The Dogs will have a banquet on Saturday evening of October 3rd and you can purchase the tickets from the new website <u>www.militartorderofthedevildog.org</u>. Our new website is online and looking good except for the Packs and Pound information that was asked for. Please read the Kennel Webmasters report and get him the information he needs. – Ben Wells






WOOF-WOOF,

-22nd & 23rd – Funeral for PDD Elmer Dapron. Warrenton, Missouri. Our WW II Veterans are a priority!

<u>September</u>

-7th – Pack Growl. Jefferson City, Missouri. Pounds must be reminded to nominate a Pack Dog of the Year.

-8th – 14th – SEMO District Fair. Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Sold MODD Iwo Jima Pistol Raffle tickets at the MCL booth.

-17th – 19th – Modern Day Marine Expo & Banquet, with the 59th CDD. Quantico, Virginia. The green, MODD polo shirts that the CDD had made, reinforced and highlighted our presence at the Expo. Great chance for Marines to learn about the MODD and our Mission. Opportunity to help out the Semper Fi Store.

-27th & 28th – Division Growl/MWD Fall Conference. Bloomington, Minnesota. The DVCDD needs to attend all Division Growls, if at all possible. This is the best opportunity to pass the word from the CDD to the Packs.

October

-12th – Pound 319 Growl/Election & Installation, with the 59th CDD. Morganton, North Carolina. Always try to have a proposed slate of Officers prior to the Growl. Dogs love shooting competitions.

-26th – Pound 373 Growl/PDD Advancement, with the 59th CDD. Marietta, Ohio. Applications for the initiation exemption for WW II & Korea Veterans should be processed as quickly as possible. Their health is fragile.

<u>November</u>

-10th – 244th Marine Corps Birthday, at the Marine Corps Museum, with the 59th CDD. Quantico, Virginia. Best day of the year. It was an Honor to spend it with the CDD.

-11th – Veterans Day Wreath Laying & National Ceremony, with the 59th CDD. Arlington, Virginia. Arrive early. The CDD or SVCDD should always attend this event. Great publicity for the MODD.

-19th – Pound 330 Growl. Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Card games work well to raise Big Bones. The Growl was a great way to take a break during the Toys For Tots campaign.

December

-7th – Pack Growl. Jefferson City, Missouri. The Missouri Pack Spirit of Belleau Wood Award, is a great tool to encourage Pounds to stay active with the Pack.

<u>January 2020</u>

-14th – Pound 330 Growl. Cape Girardeau, Missouri. Every Dog should report at a Pound Growl.

February

-1st – Pack Growl, with the 59th CDD. Middlesex, North Carolina. Shooting competitions are a lot of fun. Having a family BBQ, prior to the Growl, is a great way to turn a Growl into an EVENT that Dogs look forward to attending.

-18th – Pound 330 Growl. Cape Girardeau, Missouri. If you have active members in your MCL Detachment, recruit them into the MODD. We need to be proactive.

-22nd – Pound 77 Growl. Jefferson City, Missouri. Always choose a Pound Dog of the Year.

-27th – 29th – Kennel Mini Growl/National Mid-Winter Conference. Norfolk, Virginia. Recon. The Dog House and Kennel Store require separate spaces. You need a designated room for each. We must be ever mindful to look out for each other in regard to Social Media posts. Always watch your Buddy's "6".



<u>March</u>

-7th – Pack Growl. Jefferson City, Missouri. Good time to raise Pups to DD.

-26th – Kennel Staff Online Meeting. Kept the Meeting Notes. Communication is paramount.

<u>April</u>

That way everyone can have instructions on how to write clear and effective By-Law change requests. By-Law change requests should be submitted by Devil Dogs in the Order, not just by me. I appreciate that Dogs have confidence in my skills, but to have a majority of change requests come from the Kennel Smart Dog really isn't an ideal situation. I am more than happy to help anyone who wants to submit a change request, but these are ultimately YOUR By-Laws and should be amended by the members, not the Kennel Smart Dog.

It is time for elections to take place in the Pounds across the Kennel. The **by-laws require them to occur within 3 months following the Supreme Growl.** Some Pounds are holding elections in the spring when the League holds their elections. This is **wrong**, our by-laws are different and must be followed. Installation reports need to be sent to me so the Kennel records can be updated and the Pack and Division Vice for your area know who to contact and how to do it. Please note that the installation form has been updated and may be found on the Kennel website in an interactive format. Please use it.

The by-laws now require that all Pounds and Packs be incorporated in their state as a nonprofit corporation. If you have not done this, please get on it. There is a fine and possible suspension of your charter if it is not done. The IRS form 990 must be filed annually, if your filing is not up to date, make sure it is taken care of. If it is not, the IRS will revoke your non-profit status and it is very expensive and a lot of trouble to gain reinstatement. Check the installation report in the Scratchings to check on your Pound or Packs status.

Passport fees should be sent in after each Growl as required by the by-laws. These fees should not be held as they belong to the Children's Hospital fund and Kennel can get a little bit of interest off them if they are deposited in our account. It also lets us know that you are holding Growls and being active.



It is also time to get your dues paid. The membership year ended on Aug 31. If you are not a life member, you need to pay dues for 2021. Please get with your Dog Robber and take care of this vital matter. Some members have not paid dues for some time and were dropped from the rolls on Sept 1.

Dropped members totaled 488. This dropped our membership down to 5283. If you are in this status, you may not wear MODD insignia or ribbons. To be reinstated, Kennel back dues for a maximum of 3 years and reinstatement fees for a maximum of 3 years must be paid along with dues for the current year.

We have a total of 281 new pups this fiscal year. A total of 1308 pups in the Kennel, up from 1282 last year 1614 DD's in the Kennel, down from 1692 last year 2826 PDD's in the Kennel, down from 2860 last year 5769 Dogs in the Kennel down from 5854 last year 2160 of them are life members up from 2138 last year 2560 are current with 2020 dues paid down from 3037 last year 536 have already paid dues for 2021. 510 have not paid for 2020 and will potentially be dropped on Sept 1. We had 551 listed last year 143 have reinstated this year. This is up from 127 last year. We have had charter applications for 7 new Pounds this fiscal year. We have a total of 228 Pounds and 39 Packs in the Kennel.







From the Commandant of the Department of Louisiana



Helping in the aftermath of Hurricane Laura:

The destruction produced by this massive storm is incredible. Over the course of 18 hours, Laura caused more than \$500M in damage prompted by winds of 150 miles per hour, and a storm surge of more than 12 feet. More than 35,000 homes and businesses were severely damaged, forcing more than 15,000 citizens to find shelter elsewhere. Sadly, fifteen lives have been lost. Even with utility crews from twenty-nine states working round the clock, 250,000 remain without power and it could be four to six weeks before it is restored. There is 400,000 under a boil water advisory. Radio and television stations have been destroyed along with many cell phone towers. MCL Detachment 535 in Lake Charles, and its forty-three members, have been displaced and faced with rebuilding. But, as Marines, have placed their own misery aside to assist in the distribution of supplies and food. Marines throughout Southeast Division have graciously extended help in the form of supplies and money.

Now a challenge from me:

I know it would be hard logistically to collect supplies from all over the country and send them to Louisiana to help. However, we as DOGS can reach back and find some Bones! Each Pound or Pack can collect Bones from their Dogs whether it be \$5, \$10, \$20, or more. This is something that is dear to my heart because fifteen years ago I was going through the same thing after Hurricane Katrina. Subj: Annual Report

Upon returning, I have been tasked to promote the MODD in all aspects to the California, Arizona, Nevada Packs, and assist in the future formation of a Hawaii Pound.


We have had 6 members pass away during this last year so our overall amount of increase is on 2 overall.


